FEDERAL OSHA UPDATE: Tripping, Slipping, and Falling Hazards

OSHA has announced plans to require improved worker protection from tripping, slipping, and falling hazards on walking and working surfaces. An estimated 20 fatalities and more than 3,500 injuries occur annually which require days away from work caused by slipping or falling. Current general industry regulations are not as safe and effective as those in place for the construction and maritime industries; more stringent rules would become required in all industries. In addition, the new standard would allow OSHA to cite employers for not requiring fall protection when climbing certain types of ladders.

FEDERAL OSHA UPDATE: Hexavalent Chromium

Employers are required to notify their employees of all hexavalent chromium exposures as of **June 15, 2010**. Previously, employers were only required to notify employees if exposure exceeded the permissible exposure limit. Hexavalent chromium may be created when handling pigments, spray paints, or coatings containing chromates, operating chrome plating baths, and welding or cutting metals containing chromium (e.g. stainless steel). Exposure to hexavalent chromium increases the risk of developing lung cancer or damage to the skin and eyes.
